Most famous for locating the Titanic, he is a dedicated scientist and oceanographer (and riveting speaker) whose deep-sea discoveries have created new understanding of the origins of life on earth and the potential for finding it in the solar systems.

THURSDAY, 8:00pm

One of the most accomplished women in Government, she served in the Bush Administration Cabinet as Chairman of the Environmental Protection Agency, two terms as New Jersey's 50th Governor, and was considered as a vice presidential candidate in both 1996 and 2000.
