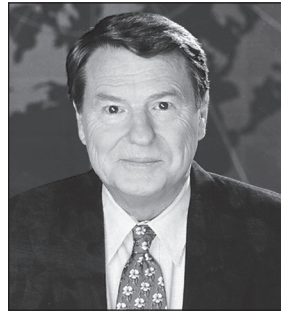

wednesday, 8:00pm

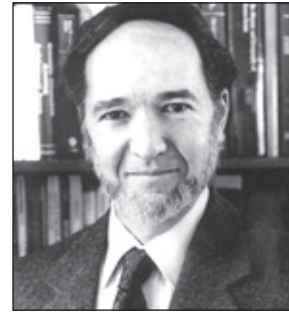
